Office Location: Isle of Tiree. You must be available to work minimum 2 days per week at our Tiree-based office for the duration of the role. This role will include travel within Argyll and the isles (separate budget available), and evening and weekend work when required.

Contract Type: Fixed-term for 12 months (extension possible depending on funding)

The Role

Purpose

The Screen Argyll Learning Coordinator will build partnerships and key relationships, supporting sectoral development of screen education provision in the Argyll and Isles. The Learning Coordinator will help Screen Argyll to develop strategy for ongoing support of our young film makers and filmmaking in Argyll and the Isles.

This new role centres on provision in island and rural communities for children and young people aged 5 to 25 - in both formal and informal education settings - who are unable to access opportunities often focused on mainland and urban areas. You will work with the Programme Manager and Screen Argyll Directors to devise and deliver year-round events and activities which support the understanding, appreciation, and creative use of film for young audiences. This role is funded by Screen Scotland.

Main responsibilities (including but not limited to):

- Building our knowledge and networks of teachers/educators, community and industry partner organisations across Argyll and nationally
- Coordinating, administrating and evaluating session work led by our small team:
 - working with the Programme Manager and Screen Argyll Directors to devise and deliver year-round learning programmes for Argyll and the Isles (in person and online)
 - supporting the delivery of (online) professional development with formal and informal educators across our region-wide network
- Acting as Event Lead for specific screenings and events, and general events production support including logistics, equipment, hospitality and audience feedback materials
- Contribute to longer term planning to ensure growth by researching and scoping strategy
 for the delivery of film education and how to maximise young people's engagement with
 opportunities throughout Argyll and the Isles (including any learning emerging from the
 Film and Screen Curriculum for Scotland pilot scheme and our programme of activity)
- Working with the Development Manager and Programme Manager to prepare and submit funding applications to support further opportunities and activities in Argyll and the isles beyond this initial 12-month period
- Contribute to the regular monitoring and evaluation of our work by feeding into verbal and written reports to external funders and stakeholders, meeting bi-monthly with the head of learning at Screen Scotland, and assisting the programme manager by managing and monitoring programme budget and payments
- Promoting and sharing our activity/work where required, producing marketing and communications copy for website, social media and mail-outs, and representing and profiling Screen Argyll to national and international partners
- Ensuring all of our safeguarding policies are kept up to date, and feeding back any best practice learned from our partners / through programme activity
- Any other duties commensurate with the scope and status of this role.
- Deliver all work in a manner that reflects Screen Argyll's values and principles.

Person Specification

The criteria below indicate the skills, experience and qualities that are required, and desired, of the successful applicant.

Essential:

- Knowledge of the processes involved in delivering a programme of learning activity in the creative sectors
- Demonstrable ability to plan, promote, organise, deliver and evaluate projects of varying sizes and with competing deadlines
- · Experience of working with and/or developing young people's skills
- Experience of working effectively with partner organisations / managing relationships
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, with an ability to work well independently, as well as part of a team and a wider organisation
- A proven ability to prioritise, demonstrate commitment, and take a creative approach to problem solving
- Experience of managing and monitoring budgets to meet financial targets
- Experience of writing or contributing to funding applications
- · Interest in and some knowledge of film

Desirable:

- Experience of teaching or skills relating to education; Knowledge of schools, the curriculum and of informal learning settings such youth clubs, libraries etc.
- Experience or skills relating to film
- Knowledge and understanding of the screen sector in the UK
- · Experience of building partnerships and nurturing networks
- Experience of working with rural communities
- Some knowledge of Gaelic language and culture
